

The rules for users of the Shiretoko Goko Lakes ground pathway were changed in 2011. It is a new system to minimize damage to nature caused by human activities and to allow visitors to enjoy the brown bear habitat more safely.

The elevated wooden path:

Visitors can walk on it freely during the opening hours.

The ground pathway:

Application procedures are required when using it during certain periods.



May 10 ~ Jul. 31

Bear Aware Season

Visitors can walk around only in Registered/authorized paid tour led by Shiretoko Goko Lakes registered guide who know how to deal with bears.

## Registered/authorized paid tour application

- Fees vary according to the tour
  - Long route: approx. ¥ 5,000 - Short route: approx. ¥ 3,500
- Registered guides will complete the application procedures on behalf of visitors

**Ecosystem Aware** Season

This is the season when there is a risk of vegetation degradation due to overcrowding in the park. Visitors can walk freely after attending a short lecture.

The ground pathway may be closed due to sightings of bears or other reasons.





The guide of this tour is equipped with the expertise to avoid brown bears. The guide is well trained in what to do if you encounter a bear and will guide you safely.



In principle, if you encounter a brown bear, you should stay together, remain calm and leave the area silently while keeping your eye on the bear.

It is important not to provoke the brown bear.



If you see a brown bear, please let your guide know immediately. The guide will assess the situation and tell you what action to take next.



If you have small children, Keep them in sight and close by.



The ground pathway may be closed if bears are sighted in the area.



# The Shiretoko Goko Lakes area is a brown bear habitat.

Consider yourself a visitor to the bears' habitat, and try not to disturb their everyday activities.

- · Do not prepare or eat food.
- · Do not feed the wildlife.
- · Do not litter.
- To avoid damage to swamps and other vegetation, do not leave the designated walkways for any reason.
- Do not enter restricted areas.
- Do not bring any plants or animals into the area (guide dogs are allowed).

- If you encounter a bear, don't panic, make a noise or run. Move slowly away while paying attention to the bear's movement. Never get close to bears.
- If you see a bear, inform the staff of the Shiretoko Goko Field House immediately.
- · Wear trekking shoes or other suitable footwear when walking on the ground pathway.
- · Mobile phones may not work in some areas.
- · Bring wet weather gear or, in some seasons, protection against the cold.
